The Prez Sez

COVID-19. It's like something out of science fiction movie (remember "The Andromeda Strain"...?). It's disrupted our lives in so many ways. We all want our lives back at some point soon, please. I've summarized below the many changes we've made and will be making at Mask & Mirror Community Theatre in the coming weeks and months.

This Season and Next Season

Like everyone and everything else, Mask & Mirror Community Theatre was thrown for a big loop, cancelling our production of Deathtrap after only two shows. In the end, we postponed our current season's final three shows - Deathtrap, Suite Surrender and Laundry & Bourbon/Lone Star - until next season.

We plan to present the following shows in their entirety as our tenth season. However, we must remain flexible based on state and local restrictions. As of June 1, Washington County will be reopening under Phase 1, which limits gatherings to a maximum of 25 attendees, with physical distancing guidelines in place. We are currently planning on our tenth season as follows (again, subject to change due to changing conditions). Exact dates will be published on the Mask & Mirror web site soon.

Tenth Season (2020-2021)

November 2020 Main stage: The Foreigner, directed by Rick Hoover

January 2021 UnMasked: The Dining Room, directed by Dan Hobbs

March 2021 Main stage: Deathtrap, directed by Tony Broom

May 2021 Main Stage: Suite Surrender, directed by Aaron Morrow

July 2021 UnMasked: Laundry & Bourbon/Lone Star, directed by Leslie Inmon

Some important details for our show patrons:

- 1) If you purchased season tickets for our current ninth season, we will honor it for our tenth season. We will reach out to our season ticket holders in the coming weeks with details on how this will happen.
- 2) If you purchased a raffle ticket during either of our March performances of Deathtrap, those tickets will be held until our next show raffle happens. They will be included in the final drawing and you will be contacted if you win.

Finances

While programs like the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), the CARES Act and others have helped many businesses large and small, Mask & Mirror has been unable to receive any assistance. We're all-volunteer, non-profit and a small theatre that doesn't receive national level arts grants, so we qualify for none of the available national assistance programs. But there is still hope: the Oregon Cultural Trust is working on a grant program for Oregon arts groups, but (due to the required approval of the Oregon Legislature) even this program is still months away.

Until such time as we can return to the stage, we are keeping our ongoing expenses to a minimum, and ask that you please consider making a donation to Mask & Mirror. To help encourage this, we've created a *new* Mask & Mirror Community Theatre T-shirt, for which Mask & Mirror receives a portion of the proceeds.
