Mask & Mirror Community Theatre Open Auditions: The Last Night of Ballyhoo

Mask and Mirror Community Theatre is excited to announce open auditions for the first show of its 6th season, "The Last Night of Ballyhoo," directed by Jayne Furlong.

When: September 7th and 8th 7-9pm

Where: Calvin Church, 10445 SW Canterbury Lane in Tigard.

Winner of the 1997 Tony Award for Best New Play, Alfred Uhry's "The Last Night of Ballyhoo" takes place in December of 1939. As Hitler prepares to invade Poland, Atlanta's German Jewish Freitag family is much more concerned with who will be attending Ballyhoo, the social event of the season. As preparations are being made for this lavish event, an unexpected visitor arrives, causing each family member to re-examine their own prejudices in their search for identity.

Four female and 3 male roles are available. No roles are pre-cast:

Boo Levy - (Mid 50s) Widowed mother of Lala and elder sister of Adolph. Social status is very important to her and she does her best to keep up appearances. Looks more German than Jewish. Deep Southern American accent.

Lala Levy - (Mid 20s) Boo's only daughter. Lala has dreams of grandeur but is very anxious and awkward. She struggles with her Jewish identity and her social status. Classic Jewish features. Deep Southern American accent.

Reba Freitag - (Late 40s-Early 50s) Sister-in-law to Adolph and Boo and loving mother to Sunny. Reba is sweet and simple, but also more shrewd than others give her credit for. Deep Southern American accent.

Sunny Freitag - (Early to Mid 20s) Daughter of Reba, Niece to Adolph and Boo, and cousin to Lala. A junior at Wellesley College, she is practical and smart, but unaware of what her heritage means in a global sense. Looks more German than Jewish. Deep Southern American accent.

Adolph Freitag - (Late 40s- Mid 50s) Middle-aged businessman. Brother to Boo and Brother-in-law to Reba. Adores Sunny, but has little tolerance for Lala. Adolph is a kind soul, who understands the good impact Joe can have on the family. Deep Southern

American accent.

Joe Farkas - (Mid 20s to Early 30s) Hard working, Jewish employee of Adolph Freitag and intellectual match to Sunny. Challenges the family to examine their ideas of identity. Very proud of his Eastern European heritage. Somewhat lost in the world of Southern customs. Brooklyn accent.

Peachy Weil - (Mid 20s to Late 30s) Son of a high society family from Lake Charles, Louisiana. Finds a match in Lala, both in vanity and ignorance. Known for his obnoxious behavior and outspokenness. You would never know he is Jewish. Deep Southern American accent.

Auditions will consist of readings from the script, which can be obtained in advance by sending an email with your name, gender and age to auditions@maskandmirror.com. Resumes and headshots are appreciated at the audition but are not required. Mask & Mirror is an all-volunteer community theatre and there is no compensation offered other than 2 comp tickets for any performance.

Performances of Ballyhoo will take place on "The Stage" at Calvin Church from November 4 - 20 (no show Nov 18), 2016, Friday & Saturday at 7:30pm, and Sunday at 2pm. Rehearsals will start immediately after auditions and usually take place Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings at Calvin Church.

Once a year we ask that you show your support for our organization and demonstrate your affiliation in a financial way. Yup, folks, it's that time!

Our dues year begins on September 1 and ends August 31. - *Publicize your acting or tech gigs in our newsletter,
- *Participate in any special social activities,
- *Vote in elections or on any issues brought to the full membership,
- *Run for office after six months of being a Member in Good Standing.

Wanna Act Sick?

The Beaverton Community Emergency Response Team - CERT, is reaching out to the community for help in providing us with actors for our training exercises.

With the goal of improving our ability to serve our families, neighborhoods, and community in an emergency, Beaverton CERT conducts simulated disaster exercises twice each year. In addition to our ongoing training, we also graduate two basic CERT classes a year. They are put through a simulated disaster scenario as part of their graduation exercise.

We are in need of people to act as patients/victims. Actual acting experience is not required!

Some actors will be made up with moulage (mock injuries), ranging from minor to severe. Depending on physical comfort level and ability, actors may be positioned in sitting, prone or semi-prone positions, as well as walking about. The more realistic we can make it, the better!

Our training exercises typically require an all-day commitment, and we will feed you, plus give you a gift as our thanks for volunteering your time. Exercises take place outside, rain or shine.

This is a great opportunity for professional and non-professional actors alike to donate a day of their time to public service doing what they love to do - act!

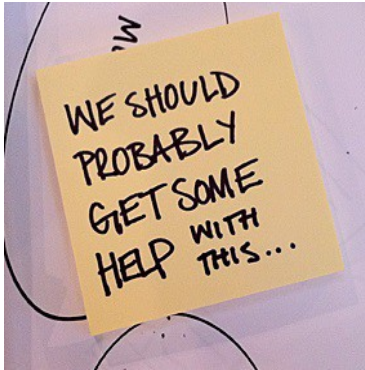

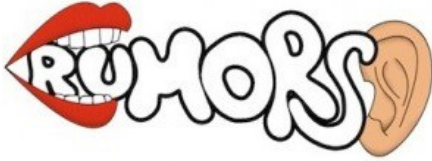

- TRAVEL TIP OF THE MONTH: When shopping for air, your computer cookies are tracked by the airline or booking site. Repeated visits to the same site signal that you're actively searching for air, and some sites will raise pricing to get you to purchase faster (bast\$&#rds!). Meanwhile, in Internet Explorer 8 or later you can access what Microsoft calls "InPrivate Browsing" under the Tools menu (or press Ctrl+Shift+P)." You can also access incognito mode in major mobile web browser applications. To turn on incognito browsing, simply visit your mobile browser's "Settings" page. Going incognito does not assure complete internet privacy. You would need a virtual private email network (or access to a major party Presidential candidate :)) to accomplish this feat. But going incognito is a great place to start when trying to keep air costs down.
