### Character Descriptions:

*Gaston (Male/ Over 50) -- An abrupt and direct old Frenchman with prostate problems. A philosopher in his own right, he seems mainly preoccupied with sex.*

*Freddy (Male/Over 40) -- The owner and bartender of the Lapin Agile. He is the boyfriend of Germaine, and while he seems to be a simple-minded man, he occasionally has some stunning insights into the human condition.*

*Germaine (Female/Over 40) -- A waitress at the Lapin Agile. She is Freddy's girlfriend, and the more well adjusted of the two. Whip smart and a formidable conversationalist, she has many ideas of what the 20th century will be like. She also had a brief fling with Picasso.*

*Albert Einstein (Male/Mid to Late 20s) -- A scientist with big aspirations. He is a genius, with a book on the way called *The Special Theory of Relativity*. While he often finds himself having to explain his theories and thoughts in a simpler fashion to the rest of the group, he is still somewhat innocent and naive.*

*Pablo Picasso (Male/Mid to Late 20s) -- A talented and charismatic painter. Extremely egotistical and self-confident, he is a serial womanizer. Constantly searching for inspiration, often at other's expense.*

*Suzanne (Female/Early to Mid 20s) -- A young and sometimes naive woman who is infatuated with Picasso. Suzanne and Picasso have already slept together once, and she has returned to the Lapin Agile hurt and angry that he doesn't remember her.*

*Sagot (Male or Female/Anywhere from Early 30s to Early 50s) -- Picasso's art dealer, who is obsessed with finding and selling great pieces of art for profit. Charming and charismatic.*

*Charles Dabernow Schmendiman (Male/Anywhere from Late 20s to Early 40s) -- A young inventor with huge dreams and little knowledge. Although he is hardworking, he is overshadowed by the genius and talent of Einstein and Picasso.*

*The Countess (Female/In Her 30s) -- An extremely intelligent and attractive woman, with whom Einstein is infatuated. She thinks like he does, being the one person to really understand him in the play.*

The Visitor (Male/Mid to Late 20s) -- A polite and talented country-boy time-traveler, who adds another dimension and point of view to Einstein's and Picasso's debate.

### Synopsis:

This long running Off Broadway absurdist comedy places Albert Einstein and Pablo Picasso in a Parisian cafe in 1904, just before the renowned scientist transformed physics with his theory of relativity and the celebrated painter set the art world afire with cubism. In his first comedy for the stage, the popular actor and screenwriter Steve Martin plays fast and loose with fact, fame, and fortune as these two geniuses muse on the century's achievements and prospects, as well as other fanciful topics, with infectious dizziness. Bystanders, including the bartender and his girlfriend, an elderly philosopher, a young woman looking to track Picasso down after a night of passion, Picasso's art dealer, and an overeager aspiring inventor introduce additional flourishes of humor. The final surprise patron to join the merriment at the Lapin Agile is a charismatic musician time warped in from a later era.
