John Knowles



John is from Illinois. He graduated from Western Illinois University and then Lewis & Clark Law School in Portland. John currently resides in Hillsboro and has one son, Ian. He is a lawyer as well as a Pro Tem Circuit Court Judge, mediator and arbitrator. (When on the bench as a judge on hot days John only smiles when asked what he is wearing under the robe.)

In 2017 he released his first CD, “Country Classics”, and his cover of “Hurt” reached No. 11 on Cashbox Magazine’s National “Americana” Chart.

It was also in 2017 that he first emerged in the theater scene and then performed in the following plays:

Oregon Cultural Trust Tax Deductible Arts Donations

OK, tax time is still a long way away - BUT did you know the Oregon Cultural Trust has a program where you can make a donation to arts in our state ABSOLUTELY FREE? Yes, it's true! Here's how it works:

First, you give a tax deductible donation to one of Oregon's over 1400 arts/heritage related nonprofit organizations, and Mask & Mirror Community Theatre is one of the qualifying organizations.

Second, you send a matching donation to the Oregon Cultural Trust by December 31st of that same year. You can do this either online at www.culturaltrust.org or mail it to their street address (775 Summer St NE, suite 200, Salem OR 97301). If you donate to multiple nonprofits from their list, you can donate up to the total amount of your multiple gifts (though see the limits in the example below).

Third, you can write that matching donation to the Oregon Cultural Trust off your 2019 Oregon taxes! This reduces your total tax bill by the same amount of your donation to the Trust, up to \$500 for an individual or \$1000 for a couple filing jointly. This isn't a reduction in your income that gets then gets

taxed - it's that much less that you pay in taxes.

For example, let's say I donate \$100 to Mask & Mirror and another \$100 to another Oregon arts nonprofit. I can then donate a matching \$200 to the Oregon Cultural Trust, and write that full \$200 off the final total of taxes I owe to the state of Oregon. Yes, \$200 off my final total tax bill, and maybe receive that as a refund if I'm owed one. As an example, if I still owed \$500 when I do my 2020 taxes, I can claim a \$200 Oregon Cultural Trust tax credit and only have to send \$300 to the State of Oregon instead. It's essentially a free donation of your tax money to Oregon arts & heritage non-profits. Please be sure to read the details on their web site and note the donation limits and required deadline.

Why might you want to do this? First, it's a good idea to fund our state nonprofit organizations like this and chances are you're already making some form of qualifying donation. This program helps that donation go twice as far. Second, Mask & Mirror has been the recipient of up to \$1800 each year for the past four years, through Oregon Cultural Trust grants supporting our UnMasked series of shows. Let's show them our love and give something back...!
